## **ARTIST STATEMENT**

Through meticulous hand embroidery on a canvas, I explore the profound themes of existentialism and the inner psyche of a country at war. My artworks, devoid of frames, confront the viewer with a blend of stark graphic elements and emotive colors, weaving a narrative steeped in melancholy and mysticism. I employ natural motifs and ancient symbols, alongside the raw expressiveness of anatomy, to craft a modernday tale that provokes introspection and a search for deeper meaning.

My choice of hand embroidery, a meticulous and timehonored technique, harkens back to times when such craft was the only means of illustrating narratives before the advent of the printing press. The textile becomes a document, recording a state of being.

This juxtaposition elevates the piece to a conversation between life and death, peace and war, preservation and decay. I invite viewers into my fairytale, a modern narrative that asks them to look beyond the surface and explore the existential threads that bind us all. The artwork becomes a silent oracle, speaking of the fragility of life and the beauty that can be found even in its end.



# **BOGI**

#### **RESIDENCY PROJECT - 2023**

This project was made during a two-month residency at the Tartu House of Art, organized in partnership with the Estonian Creative Residency Network LOORE and funded by the Nordic and Baltic Mobility Programme.

In the triptych GODS, I reflect on the theme of finding a foothold in religion. In today's world full of uncertainty, wars, and catastrophes, people are constantly in existential dread of what is happening. The chaos created by war destroys the essence of our self-beliefs and ideas about ourselves and the world, leaving gaps in our thoughts and emptiness in our souls. How can you fill them to regain your integrity? Only with something greater and more powerful than yourself. But what is a person to do if escaping into religiosity does not bring relief or help find answers to overcome life's crises? Based on my own experience of immersion in different religions, I reflect on what is behind the images of ancient gods. Were they real personalities or are they just a cocoon of myths and legends? What if our gods were aliens or representatives of another race? Is it possible to seek support and protection from someone who thinks in different categories and lives according to different principles than we do?





### **INNER GARDEN**

#### PROJECT 2022-2023

The cross-cutting theme of my artistic practice is the symbol of the tree. Images of trees in one form or another constantly appear in my works: in painting, in embroidery, in installation projects.

For me, the tree is the embodiment of the cosmic principle, the embodiment of the universe on canvas. The roots of the tree, penetrating deep into the earth, symbolize the connection to the past, to the ancestors, the source of all things. It is the roots give life to a mighty trunk and sprawling branches - the embodiment of the many ways of future development. The cyclical change of seasons of flowering and fading, by analogy with the cyclical nature of life, which reflects the symbol of immortality and diversity.


In my embroidered works, the tree appears as a living being that can move freely, with eyes, hands and mouth. It is a kind of analogy with the world of childhood, where a child's imagination can give certain properties to objects that at first glance seem inanimate. I am interested in exploring how these childhood experiences influence my art now.



Diptych textile, embroidery, acrylic each piece 45x45cm




# ELECTRO SKOVORODA

#### **PROJECT FOR THEATRE 2023**

This project was created in collaboration with the contemporary experimental theater VIE in Zaporizhzhia.

I designed a series of costume sketches for the play Elektroskovoroda. It is a musical performance that combines electronic music and philosophical texts by Grigory Skovoroda. He lived in the 18th century and was known as an itinerant philosopher, poet, fable writer, and educator who made a significant contribution to East Slavic culture. In his writings, the central place is occupied by the problem of self-knowledge, which is inevitably reduced by the philosopher to the question of the nature of the human being, of life and death, of love and God.

In the sketches I developed I used religious symbols, natural motifs characteristic of folk paintings, as well as images from the philosopher's texts. For example, the "fountain" of Gregory Skovoroda, symbolizes God's mercy spilling on people. I had the idea of using fluorescent fabrics, which create the effect of luminous ornaments, and they seem to float in the air by themselves. That added an extra mystical sound to the performance.




